# LCC 16/101 PARKING ISSUES, SCHOOL ROAD, LLANARTHNE

Mr Andrew J. Morgan, Traffic Engineer, Carmarthenshire County Council confirms the following in a recent email:

With regards to your request for a residents parking scheme to be introduced along School Road, Llanarthne, I would inform you that controlled residents parking schemes are aimed primarily for town centre locations where non — residents may avail of an alternative parking location(i.e. a public car park). Residents parking schemes are provided in areas where vehicles not belonging to residents (i.e. commuters, shoppers etc.) are making parking for residents difficult.

Controlled residents parking schemes in Carmarthenshire are introduced on a zonal basis, typically with two or more adjoining streets constituting the zone. Amalgamating a number of streets into the zone provides more opportunity for residents to locate a kerbside parking space within the zone. Single streets are not usually considered. A whole estate or the inclusion of adjoining roads / side roads would be more appropriate for a scheme to be effective, as any displaced parking would likely also affect the surrounding streets. As explained above, a 'zoned' parking scheme is therefore preferred for most applications.

School Road in Llanarthne joins with the B4300. The B4300 is a strategic route and as such would not be considered appropriate for inclusion in a residents parking scheme. This criteria applies to all existing residents parking schemes in the County.

Controlled residents parking schemes are enforced each day that the scheme is in operation. As permit holders pay for residents parking service, they reasonably expect that the scheme is enforced on a daily basis. This is practical in a town centre where the civil enforcement officers conduct regular / daily patrols. The Councils parking service does not have the officer resources to patrol Llanarthne each day.

Having considered the request to introduce a scheme of controlled residents parking in School Road, Llanarthne, I have considered the following factors:

- School Road is not within reasonable walking distance of a County council
  operated car park, affording an alternative parking area
- 2. School Road adjoins a strategic road

I regret therefore that the conditions for a residents parking scheme are therefore not met for School Road, Llanarthne.

This was regarded as a disappointing outcome from the Authority, the clerk will contact the local residents affected and notify them of this response.

#### LCC 16/102 SPEEDING ISSUES LLANARTHNE VILLAGE

In a recent email (12.12.216) to the clerk, Mr Mike Jacob confirms the following:

As an update, the village was discussed in last week's SMG (Speed Management Group Meeting). GoSafe (Safety Camera Partnership) have officially adopted the village as a Community Concern site and have as such commenced enforcement. Enforcement will now continue on a regular basis when the results will be discussed at the next Speed Management in April 2017.

In addition to the above will be also monitoring traffic speeds before the next SMG to ascertain the impacts of the enforcement.
